May 5th - Canadian National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and 2SLGBTQ+ People (MMIWG2S)

The day honours missing/murdered Indigenous individuals, supports families, and demands action on the disproportionately high rates of violence, stemming from systemic factors, racism, and colonial legacies.

Origin:

The day was inspired by the *REDress Project* art installation by Metis artist Jaime Black in 2010, which used hanging red dresses to represent the lost lives. Today, people wear red and display red dresses to raise awareness.

Action to Raise Awareness:

Use hashtags like #RedDressDay, #MMIWG2S, and #NoMoreStolenSisters on social media.

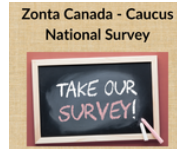
